The Right Door Service Options

The Right Door for Hope, Recovery and Wellness provides services to help support your recovery and well-being.

Recovery: "Mental health recovery is a journey of healing and transformation enabling a person with a mental health problem to live a meaningful life in a community of the person's choice while striving to achieve ... full potential."*

Components of Recovery: self-direction, individualized and person-centered, empowerment, holistic, non-linear, strengthsbased, peer support, respect, responsibility, and hope.

For Veterans, it is important that we recognize the additional components when providing treatment: privacy, security, honor, and support for Veterans and active duty military.

As a Veteran, you have a choice of who provides your treatment. We hope to provide services that enable you to achieve your full potential while respecting and acknowledging the unique strengths, needs, abilities and preferences you bring with you as a Veteran.

Our Access Clinicians can assist with providing an initial screen for all services available to you. Please feel free to make accommodation requests when scheduling this appointment.

The Right Door—Ionia Office has two on-site Certified Veteran Service Officers. You can call to schedule an appointment.

Veterans Service Officers are available to help you connect with the resources you need. If they can't help you with your concern, they can connect you to someone who can.

They can assist you with:

- Finding benefits that pertain to you.
- Providing free expert advice regarding your case.
- Providing literature and information for entitlement programs.
- Filing for benefits from all levels of eligibility.
- Advocating on your behalf through the appeal process if this should become necessary.

Ionia County Veterans Court:

The Right Door works in collaboration with the Ionia County Veterans Court to assist in connecting county Veterans with mental health and substance use treatment. Veterans Treatment Court uses a hybrid integration of drug court and mental health court principles to serve military Veterans. They promote sobriety, recovery, and stability through a coordinated response.
